

# **BASIC GUIDELINES TO PHARMACISTS**

**LEGAL POINTS TO BE REMEMBERED AND TO BE FOLLOWED BY PHARMACISTS.**

**DRUGS AND COSMETICS RULES 1945**

**I. Rule 65 (2):-**

All Prescription Drugs prescribed by allopathic doctor to be sold under personal supervision of a Pharmacist.

**II. (i) Rule 65 (3) (1) and 65 (4) (1):-**

Maintain Prescription Registers for Schedule 'H' Drugs and Schedule 'C' Drugs even though you maintain the sales bill book with details like Serial Number, Name of the Drug, Batch Number, Date of Sales, Name and Address of the patient etc.

**(ii) Rule 65 (3) (2) and 65 (4) (2):-**

An option to maintain all particulars in bill book, and a request for exemption from writing the registers can be made with the Licensing Authority to get an Exemption Certificate.

**III. Rule 65 (4) (3): (Sales Bills):-**

(i) The sale of drugs to be done only against a cash or credit bill.

The sales bill should contain:

- a. Name, address and sale license No. of the dealer.
- b. Serial No. of the Bill and Date.
- c. Name of the Drug.
- d. Batch Number.
- e. Quantity.
- f. Name of Physician and Name of Patient.

(ii) Carton copies of the sales bill to be maintained for a period of two years.

**IV. Rule 65 (4) (4): (Purchase Bills):-**

(i) Purchase bills to be maintained for a period of two (2) years.

Purchase bills should contain:

- a. The date of Purchase.
- b. The Name and Address of supplier and License No.
- c. Name of Drug, Quantity and Batch No.
- d. The name of the Manufacturer of Drug.

(ii) Purchase bills to be given Serial No. and to be maintained in a chronological order.

**V. Rule 65 (6):-**

Produce all records and registers to the Inspector on demand.

**VI. Rule 65 (7):-**

Keep all the records and registers up to 2 years from the date of entry.

a. **VII. Rule 65 (9):-**

a. schedule 'H' and 'X' Drugs to be sold on Prescription of allopathic doctor only.  
Two prescriptions are required for dispensing the Schedule 'X' Drugs and one copy to be retained by the chemist for 2 years.

b. Schedule 'H' and 'X' Drugs to be supplied to an allopathic doctor or Hospital against a signed order only and signed order to be prescribed for years.

Here two (2) questions will arise

- a. What is a Signed Order?
- b. How much Quantity you can supply?

A signed Order is an order form or a letter of written order like

E.g.

**VIII. Rule 65 (11):-**

Schedule 'H' and Schedule 'X' Drugs should not be dispensed more than once unless the doctor mentions on the Prescription.

**IX. Rule 65 (11-A):-**

Substitution cannot be done even though the same ingredient is there without consent of the doctor in case of Schedule 'H' and Schedule 'X' Drugs.

**X. Rule 65 (12):-**

- a. Schedule 'X' Drugs to be kept under lock and key.
- b. Keep separately and only responsible person should have access.

**XI. Rule 65 (15) (b):-**

Display the name board of the shop with description 'Chemists and Druggists' who have employed the services of Pharmacist.

**XII. Rule 65 (16):-**

Maintain an inspection book preferably in Form-35 issued by the department.

**XIV. Rule 65 (17):-**

- i. Do not stock expired drugs along with the salable drugs.
- ii. Keep them in the cartons separately with the words 'Not for Sale'.

**XV. Rule 65 (18):-**

Do not keep the drugs labeled as 'Physician Sample Not for Sale' or 'Government supply Not for Sale'

**XVI. Rule 65 (19):-**

When you are dispensing loose tablets/capsules/ophthalmic applicaps, it should be done in presence of Pharmacist only in an envelope or wrapper with a. name of drug, b. quantity, c. name and address of the dealer in an hygienic environment.

**XVII. Rule 65 (20):-**

Veterinary drugs to be kept separately in a cupboard with the words, 'Not for Human Use - for treatment of animals only'.

**XVIII. Rule 65 (21):-**

While dispensing the Schedule 'X' Drugs, maintain register withal particulars like date of transaction, quantity received, name of supplier, name of drug, quantity sold, batch number, name of patient etc.

**XVIII. CONDITIONS OF LICENSE: Rule 61 (1):-**

- i. Display the license in a prominent place open to the public in the shop.
- ii. Purchase the drugs only from a licensed dealer or licensed manufacturer under a valid and genuine bill.
- iii. Do not supply the drugs to the unlicensed premises.
- iv. Inform to the Drugs Inspector or Assistant Director, if any change of Constitution or Partnership takes place, within (3) months from the date of change.
- v. The sale of drugs to be done under the personal supervision of a Registered Pharmacist (R.P.) only.

**GUIDELINES TO RETAIL CHEMISTS**

**I. DISPENSING OF DRUGS:-**

1. Pharmacist/Chemist should verify the legality and genuineness of a Prescription before dispensing it and verify the qualification of a doctor who prescribed the drugs.
2. RMP - Registered Medical Practitioner having degree like MBBS/BDS/BVSC only.  
RMP - Rural Medical Practitioner.  
PMP - Private Medical Practitioner.  
BAMS- Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery  
BHMS- Bachelor of Homeopathic Medicine and Surgery.

3. Cross prescribing is prohibited as per Supreme Court Order.
4. Cross prescribing means a Medical Practitioner studied in one system of medicine and prescribing medicines from another system of medicine.
5. Check for the doctor's full name, qualification and Registration Number and Phone number.
6. Check for the Patient's full name, age, weight, sex like Male/Female (Address and Phone No. if any).
7. If it is a Veterinary Prescription, the name of animal owner and type of animal, and weight to be written on the Prescription.
8. Check for the name of medicine (generic/ brand), strength, dosage form like Tablets/ Capsules/Syrup/Injection/Powder etc., dose and total quantity; date etc., and doctor's signature at the end of Prescription.
9. Do not refill the prescription, unless the doctor gives refill information.
10. Put the Stamp 'Dispensed' on the Prescription so as to avoid re-use of Prescription.
11. Drugs are of two categories:-
  - i. Prescription drugs: -
    - a. Schedule 'H' Drugs.
    - b. Schedule 'X' Drugs c NDPS Drugs.
  - ii. Non-Prescription Drugs: -
    - a. Schedule 'K' (House Hold Remedies) Drugs.
    - b. OTC (Over the Counter Drugs).
12. Schedule 'H' Drugs are potent drugs about 536 drugs in number to be sold on prescription of doctor and to be sold against a proper sale bill in the supervision of Pharmacist.
13. Schedule 'X' drugs are about 15 drugs in number like barbital's and amphetamines to be sold on prescription of a doctor in presence of Pharmacist, Stamp and retain copy of prescription, maintain record of purchase and sales and preserve for a period of 2 years and to store under lock and key.
14. NDPS drugs are Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances like Pethidine/ Morphine or Paracodine etc., are Narcotic Drugs. Psychotropic Drugs are like Alprazolam, Diazepam etc., to be stored under lock and key and to be sold in presence of Pharmacist against the sale bill only. For sale of Narcotic drugs one has to obtain special license from the department.
15. Schedule K (House Hold Remedies) drugs are like Aspirin Tablets, Paracetamol Tablets, Analgesic Balms, antacids, Gripe Water, Inhalers etc., are to be sold under 20A License without a Pharmacist in a village where there is no medical shop.
- 16...OTC drugs are over the Counter drugs which are not included in any Schedules.
17. OTC drugs can be sold without prescription of a doctor and without a pharmacist. E.g., OTC drugs are
 

Paracetamol 500 mg. Tabs. Calamine Lotion, Clotrimazole Cream, Anacin Tabs., etc.

18. Do not keep the drugs labeled as 'Physician Sample Not for Sale' and 'Government Supply Not for Sale' in the shop.
19. Retailer should maintain Prescription Register for the sale of Schedule 'C' and Schedule 'H' Drugs.
20. Retailer can make use of option to maintain a Cash/Credit bill book and can seek Exemption Certificate from the Licensing Authority, provided a separate application is made with a request and with an undertaking to maintain all the particulars in bill book only.
21. Display the license in a prominent place visible to the public.
22. Do not sell prescription drugs in the absence of Pharmacist.
23. Display the Registered Pharmacist Certificate in the shop visible to the public and R.P. certificate to be renewed for every 5 years.
24. As per the drug rules, Door delivery and telephonic orders cannot be entertained for the supply of prescription drugs.
25. Non-Prescription drugs can be sold on telephonic order and can be delivered at the doorstep.
26. Drugs like Sildenafil Citrate and Tadalafil to be sold on prescription of 'Venerologist/ Dermatologist/Urologist/Psychiatrist/Endocrinologist only but not on prescription MBBS/MD (General Medicine) or M.S. Doctor. Purchase and Sales to be tallied on verification.

## **II. PROCUREMENT OF DRUGS:-**

1. Do not fall prey to hawkers and brokers as the attractive schemes are offered.
2. Procure from genuine dealers against a proper purchase bill so as to avoid spurious drugs.
3. Better conduct vendor audit before placing an order.
4. Check whether stocks are received as per the order list.
5. Check for any defective medicines are received.
6. Check whether the cold chain is maintained for thermolabile/cold storage drugs.
7. Check for any changes in the labeling or any color of ingredients is changed.
8. If any changes are observed, inform to the concerned Drugs Inspector, and also bring to the notice of wholesaler or supplier.
9. Maintain a Stock Return Register for defective drugs/N.S.Q. drugs return/Banned Drugs Return etc.,
10. Computerization of procurement is always advisable.
11. Follow the principle of 'No bill No transaction' to avoid majority of the problems

### **III. STORAGE OF DRUGS:-**

- i. Observe the labeling condition of the each and every drug.
- ii. If mentioned as store under a cool Place, that means store between 10 Degree C and 25 Degree C.
- iii. If mentioned as store under a cold place, that means store at temperature not exceeding 8 Degree C.
- iv. Capsules to be stored at temperature not exceeding 30 Degree C.
- v. If mentioned as store at room temperature, that means temperature prevailing in that area, not exceeding 30 Degree C.
- vi. Do not freeze means, not to be stored in the freezer chamber.
- vii. Protect from moisture means, store at Relative Humidity (RH) less than 60% i.e., at normal room temperature.
- viii. Protect from light means, store at light resistant cupboard/drawer and to avoid direct Sunlight exposure.
- ix. Do not keep food items in the fridge so as to avoid the contamination of microorganisms.
- x. Provide clean environment in the premises as well as in the fridge.
- xi. If any damaged/poor quality/fungus/ foreign particles are observed in the drugs, inform to the Drugs Inspector and also to the Supplier. Keep them aside until the clarification is received from the Company.
- xii. Poor storage condition will lead to drug degradation/ instability.
- xiii. Computerization of drugs purchase is recommended for better monitoring of expiry dates.
- xiv. Better follow FIFO system i.e, First in First Out so as to avoid expiry of drugs.
- xv. Periodical checking is recommended to avoid the expiry of drugs.
- Xvi. All TT's, Vaccines and insulins to be stored at 2 to 8 Degree C only.
- xvii. Medicines are different from other consumer products. Store them appropriately.
- xviii. Provide the storage facility like fridge/walk-in-cooler/cold room as per the requirement/demand.
- xix. Provide Power back-up facility for continuous storage of drugs at the required temperature.
- xx. Do not switch off the fridge, while closing the shop.
- xxi. Dispatch the thermolabile drugs in thermocol boxes with ice packs.

#### **IV. RATIONAL USE OF DRUGS: -**

Distribute the pamphlets and display the banners containing the following Precautions to the consumers before use of drugs.

1. Avoid self-medication.
2. Approach qualified doctor for proper treatment.
3. Purchase medicines on doctor's prescription from licensed shop and demand for the bill as it helps in future claims.
4. Observe the date of expiry before leaving the counter.
5. Observe the storage conditions in case of refrigerated drugs like vaccines, insulins etc.,
6. Use drugs as advised by the Doctor, Pharmacist.
7. Keep all the drugs out of reach of the children.
8. Maintain proper storage conditions while stocking drugs in your house.
9. Use eye drops within one month of opening the bottle.
10. Shake well before use for all suspensions.
11. Use boiled and cooled water for reconstituting the dry syrup.
12. Immediately stop usage of drugs on event of reaction and consult your doctor.
13. Use complete course as prescribed by the Doctor.
14. Destroy all the date expired drugs.
15. Avoid Alcohol/Grape fruit juice during medication.
16. A healthy person can donate blood up to a maximum of four times a year  
Encourage blood donation.
17. In case of any complaint contact your nearest Drugs Inspector.

#### **V. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:-**

1. Check for expiry of drugs for every 1 or 2 or 3 months regularly in the Shop Premises.
2. Check for expiry before dispensing of drugs also.
3. Keep the premises of the shop clean and neat at all the times. Cleanliness is the next to Godliness.
4. Keep the regurgitation also cleaned at regular intervals i.e., weekly once or once in a month.
5. Keep the shelves clean using a clean cloth for every 2 - weeks.
6. Computerized Sales Bill is preferable than the manual billing.
7. Give the original bill to the customer duly signed by the Pharmacist and preserve the carbon copy for a period of 2 years.

8. While dispensing the loose tablets, capsules or ophthalmic applicaps, your hands should be clean as you have to count them. Preferably use hand gloves and counter plates and dispense the drugs in paper pouches.
9. Always greet the Patient/Consumer with a smile and explain how to use medicines or medicated devices.
10. Maintain a designated area/cupboard or shelf for the storage of expired goods and label them 'Expired goods Not for Sale'.
11. Do not mix the expired drugs along with the salable drugs.
12. Return the expired goods to the stockist within the specified period or destroy them by burning or by burying.
13. Wear a clean and neat apron during working hours in the shop. It will mark the professional dignity.
14. Wash hands with soap while entering into the shop.
15. Do not wipe hands/face to the apron.
16. Maintain Personal Cleanliness at all times.
17. When you receive the stock from the wholesaler, check the stock item wise against the invoice for correctness of the name, strength and expiry date and the batch number. If any discrepancy found, inform the supplier immediately.

#### **VI. CONDITIONS OF LICENCE: RULE 61(1):-**

- i. Display the license in a prominent place open to the public in the shop.
- ii. Purchase the drugs only from a licensed dealer or licensed manufacture under a valid and genuine bill.
- iii. Do not supply the drugs to the unlicensed premises.
- iv. Inform to the Drugs Inspector pr Assistant Director, if any change of Constitution or Partnership takes place, within (3) months from the date of change.
- v. The sale of drugs to be done under the personal supervision of a Registered Pharmacist (R.P) only.

#### **I. OFFENCES & PUNISHMENTS UNDER Drugs Act & Rules:-**

- a. Any Contravention of conditions of license in an offence & punishable u/s 27(d) Drugs

Rules, 1945 is compoundable offence and fine will be imposed based on approval of Telangana Government Authority.

- b. Penalty for sale of Adulterated/spurious drugs which can cause death/grievous

Hurt/harm on the body shall be arrested and punishable with life imprisonment u/s 27 (a) of Drugs Rules, 1945.

- c. Stocking or sale of Drugs without drugs license punishable u/s 27 (b) (ii) of drugs Rules, 1945 up to 5 years imprisonment and fine not less than one lakh rupees.

## **II. OFFENCES & PUNISHMENTS UNDER Pharmacy Act 1948:-**

- i. **U/s 26 A:** If any person willfully obstructs Pharmacy Inspector in the exercise of powers, shall be liable to penalty which may extend to 1 lakh Rupees.
- ii. **U/s 41(1):** If any person falsely claiming to be registered Pharmacist, shall be punishable on first conviction with fine which may extend to 1 lakh Rupees and on subsequent conviction with imprisonment which may extend to 3 months or with fine not exceeding 2 lakh rupees or with both.
- iii. **U/s 42(2):** In case of dispensing by unregistered persons whoever contravenes the provisions shall be punishable imprisonment which may extend to 3 months or with fine which may extend to 2 lakh rupees or with both. If penalty not paid, it may be recovered as an arrear of land revenue.
- iv. **U/s 43(1):** If any person whose name has been removed from the register fails to surrender his certificate of registration, he shall be punishable with fine which may extend to fifty (50) rupees.
- v. **U/s 34(2):** Where a renewal fee is not paid by the due date, the Registrar shall remove the name of the defaulter from the register.
- vi. **U/s 36:** The Executive Committee may order that the name of registered Pharmacist shall be removed from the register on account of misrepresentation or suppression of material fact or convicted of any offence or infamous conduct or offence under Drugs and cosmetics Act etc.

## **III.OFFENCES & PUNISHMENTS Under The Pharmacy Practice Regulations, 2015:**

- i. **U/r 4.2:** For Renewal of Registration, the Pharmacist Shall attend minimum 2 refresher courses in Pharmacy of minimum one-day duration each in a span of 5 years organized by one of the following body.
  - a. Pharmacy Council of India (PCI), New Delhi.
  - b .Telangana State Pharmacy Council(TGPC).
  - c.Central Government or Telangana State Government
  - d.Professional bodies recognized by the Council such as Indian Pharmaceutical Association (IPA) and Indian Pharmacy Graduates Association (IPGA) etc.
- ii. **U/r 12.1:** Soliciting of patients directly or indirectly by a registered Pharmacist is unethical and the registered Pharmacist shall not advertise his name.
- iii. **U/r 12.2:** A Registered Pharmacist shall not give or offer commission or bonus for sale or dispensing of medicines and shall not rebate or refund of any fee for dispensing or sale of medicines.
- iv. **U/r 13:** A Registered Pharmacist shall constitute professional misconduct liable for disciplinary action for violation of any of the regulations formed under the Pharmacy Act.
- v. **U/r 14:** if the registered Pharmacist is found to be guilty of committing professional misconduct, the PCI or TGPC may award such punishment as deemed necessary or

may direct the removal altogether or for a specified period from the register. Deletion from the register shall be widely publicized in local press as well as in the publication of different Pharmacy Associations/so cities/bodies.
